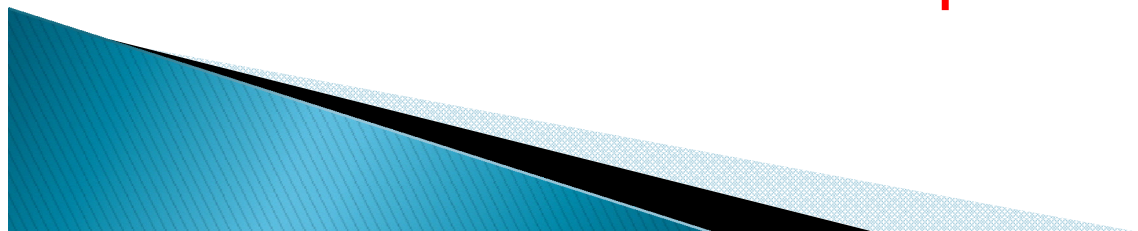


Entry Requirements:

- ▶ Leaving certificate, Level 4 certificate or equivalent in a relevant subject area (Healthcare/Childcare/Sports) **and/or relevant practical experience (3 years minimum)**
- ▶ Learners will be required to undertake a practical supervised work placement (150 hours minimum) within the relevant vocational area.

or

- ▶ **Learners must currently be working (or on work experience) in the childcare sector for a minimum of 6 hours per week**
